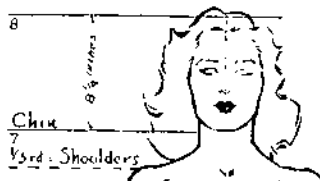

It's amazing we have so many listings this month, when so many of Brighton's best performers are appearing at the Edinburgh Festival.

At the Assembly Rooms, the main Fringe venue, we find Simon Fanshawe, Pete McCarthy and Attacco Decente all headlining their own shows as well as Brighton's adopted sons 'The Real Sounds of Africa' who play the main ballroom there for ten days.

The Zap Club have taken over Edinburgh's Rose Street, where by day J J Waller will present the best outdoor entertainers in the UK - many from Brighton. The Brighton Bottle Orchestra are at the Comedy Boom for the whole Festival. Famous Brighton football fan Atilla The Stockbroker - the missing link between George Formby and The Clash - teams up with Sensible Footwear at the Crown Theatre.

The production of 'The World Turned Upside Down', starring Peter Cleall, written and directed by Paul Hodson and Chris Stagg and with music by Attacco Decente gets a three-week run at the Mandela Theatre, where it will no doubt repeat the success it had at Brighton's Pavilion and Nightingale theatres.

At the Roxburghe Hotel, Principal Parts present The Life and Times of Maggie and Dennis according to [former Brighton resident] Steve Bell - the first adaptation of The Guardian's strip cartoon.

The Blues Review are also there, as is classical guitar trio Trio Elan and Club Sandino.

So what does this demonstrate? Well, apart from the fact that Brightonians needn't bother to go, it shows once again that Brighton's performers are up there with the best of them.

Summer's here – which in Brighton means frolicking in the parks rather than fighting in the streets. Free outdoor entertainment is the theme for the Zap in the Park events and the 1987 Brighton Urban Free Festival – BUFF to you.

BUFF Back on The Level

More news for all you outdoor types. BUFF is back, on The Level and in the Richmond on Saturday August 22 from noon until 9pm.

BUFF has become part of the furniture over the last few summers, so there was some worry that last year's 'bit of trouble' may have put the project on ice. We spoke to the organisers about this: 'This year we have had to overcome a particular shortage of time and money, but we have cajoled the Council into something like enthusiastic support, and even the Police are favourably inclined at the moment. One condition, though, is that we move the heavily amplified music into the Richmond.'

'The basic arrangements are now complete, and the programme is filling up fast. However, the more the merrier, and we are keen to hear from anyone wishing to perform. We particularly invite all buskers to The Level on the 22nd.'

Booked so far are Wax Cabinet, The Pierrotters, Roy Smiles, The Hondas, The Jazz Co-op, and McDermott's Two Hours (or McDermott's Half Hour as the press release says – someone's getting confused with Herbie Hancock). There will be a crèche, and children's events will include inflatables, games, clowning and competitions. Plus stalls for clothes, food, jewellery, books, bric-a-brac and political/community organisations.

Every year, BUFF supports a charity with collections on the day. This year the money will go to a trust fund set up by Brighton Council to help provide medical aid and basic services for a town in Nicaragua

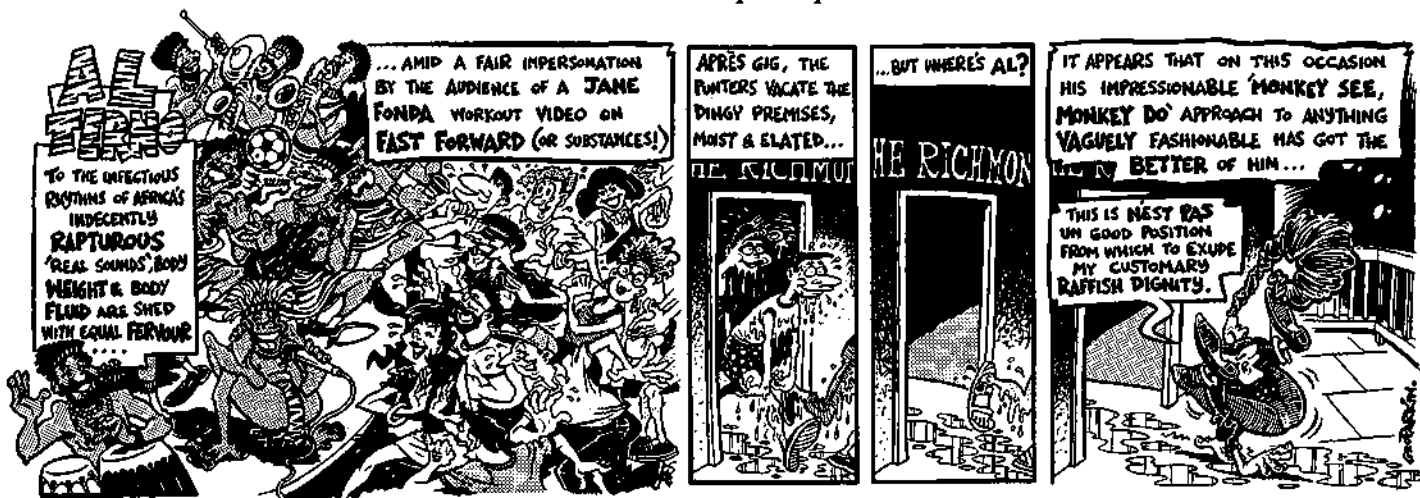

Conference contributors include Sir George Trevelyan, Mark Braham of the International Association for Integrative Education, Prof. Dobrila Belamaric (artist and author from Yugoslavia), Dr Shelagh Doonan of the Society for Social Responsibility in Science, and representatives from the Green Party, the Steiner School, the College of Psycho-Therapeutics, and the Metacentre – on Natural Water Birth.

Action groups will focus upon Natural Birth, Healthy Dying, Relationships and Marriage, Meditation, the Sacred Arts, and Youth in Action.

The whole conference has been set up by the Mediating Network, a non profit organisation based in Brighton whose aim is 'to serve the spirit of the New Era by helping to link the parts into a greater, supportive whole.'

Any band that can fill the Richmond is well on its way. Gamut managed to do so on July 1.

They've been playing together for 2 years, and it shows, the band are very proficient musicians. Lots of time changes are handled adeptly. Credit here is mainly due to the new addition to the band - Russell Haynes, who used to play with The Four Guns but joined Gamut because he wanted to play more challenging music.

At the moment the band have no vocalist. Their sets consist entirely of instrumentals, mainly written by Pat Gordon, the keyboards player. Their influences are Tull, Clannad, Bruford, Fripp - and they call their style 'medieval rock'.

Although they play 'medieval' music, and are influenced by Jethro Tull, the band assure me they have no plans to wear flares or cod-pieces.

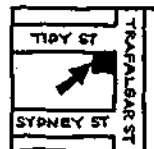

How many bands make five?

Hang Ten Local Bands

Paper Boats In Puddles is a compilation album featuring local bands, and is out this month on Hang Ten Records. It has been put together by Virgin Megastore DJ Stuart Jones, with a little help from his friends – notably Jonathan Honda, who performs as Jesus Couldn't Drum.

The Punter interviewed them about the LP.

Punter: Why the strange title?

Stuart: It's the title of a Jesus Couldn't Drum song. I liked it because it's coy and doesn't mean anything. But more than that, it paints a really nice picture in your mind.

Punter: How did you choose the tracks for the LP?

Stuart: Pure indulgence. They are my favourites of the local demos I've heard over the years since 1981.

Punter: How did you get involved, Jonathan?

Jonathan: Stuart and I had done a lot together in the past. Then he got this job [as Virgin DJ] I'm gonna give up drinking and put the money to better use. Had Stuart stuck to this, the record would have been released earlier!

Punter: Which tracks do you like best?

Jonathan: I like Jennie's best [Jennie Cruse – 'Don't You Think']. I'm very fond of her. Also 'Swamp Walk', the ultimate instrumental ['Swamp Walk' by The Little Legends].

Punter: Was it easy getting this LP out?

Stuart: It's been said before, but not enough. It is easy. Making a record is: a/ having the money, and

b/ having the right phone numbers. It's just like buying a packet of sweets or a beer, or a pair of underpants. There's no great mystery.

Punter: I've heard that you're both vinyl junkies.

Jonathan: Yes, I've got a thousand LPs.

Punter: And the most interesting?

Jonathan: I've got a double LP of the Communist Manifesto set to music.

Punter: Where do you frequent in Brighton?

Jonathan: The usual youth hangouts – the Zap Club and Virgin. I've been to the Sunshine Playroom – that's a romp and a half. But as I don't enjoy alcohol, I'm not really a nightclub person.

Punter: Final word?

Stuart: I really believe in compilations, having light and shade. This has blazing technicolor. It's also got cartoon pop, atmospheric poetry, and twangy guitar.

So we listened to it – just for you...

This ranks with the first Vaultage LP as one of the best local compilations. Favourites are For a Moment and My Heart Belongs To Daddy, by Q Dance, but why is Jo's voice mixed as though she's singing in a tube station? If she can sing like Ella Fitzgerald, Lena Horne or Sarah Vaughan (and she can) there's no need.

Lots of pop charm from Jennie Cruse and The Red Squares; Shadows/Morricone instrumentals by The Little Legends; pre-Mission Gothic from This Colour; and Hove poetry from The Rev.

All in all an excellent slice of Brighton-based pop music in the eighties.



The Vaultage compilations did it – the Zap filled the gap – now Hang Ten and Hag! Records catch the sound of the South Coast.

Hag's Out

Bands from Brighton to Bournemouth are gathered together on the Hag! compilation. It features tracks from The Fence, The Regular Guys, The Electric Circus, Salad From Atlantis and How Many Beans Make Five? (all from Brighton); Flik Spatula, The Cropdusters, Cement Garden, Who's In The Kitchen? and First Men In Space (Southampton); and The Spoons plus The Swis (keeping it brief in Bournemouth). Who's In The Kitchen? also have a new single out (with a rather intriguing cover) entitled 'Government Rap'/'Condom Nation'.

The compilation album is a difficult animal – who wants a dozen tracks by a dozen different bands? That said, if you're into post-punk, post-goth, pre-seventies, mid-Bowie, early Velvets, occasionally wimpish guitar-based rock, then this is for you. Personally speaking, it's not my favourite genre, but there is some talent washing around here. The Regular Guys get the best song-title, 'What The Cosmopolitan Girl Said To The Hometown Boy', and possibly the best song. I'd rate Who's In The Kitchen? as lyrically and musically the most interesting, and The First Men In Space as the closest thing to Gong to appear recently. Take that as you will. The Cropdusters are a bit of an oddity, with their born-to-dance-on-speed hoedowns; probably kick up a storm on live gigs.

For the rest, you'd better listen to it yourselves. In your local shops now, or ring Phil Nelson on 0273 692048 for the House that Hag! Built.

Carry On Camping

I've got a book published in the 1920s, a serious book called 'The Anatomy of Laughter'. I keep it for the title. Is it possible to write a book about humour that doesn't kill its subject stone dead?

The answer is unquestionably YES. The proof lies in 'The Joke's On Us' by Morwenna Banks and Amanda Swift, subtitles 'Women in Comedy from Music Hall to the Present', and published by Pandora Press.

The book covers a wide range of forms, styles and genres; fits in interviews and photos of nearly 100 comedienne – including Brighton's very own Becky Stevens; looks at issues like the limits of acceptability in what a woman can say on stage about sex before the men start feeling undermined; and has a lot of great jokes:

He said: If I'd've known you were a virgin, I'd've taken more time.

She said: If I'd've known you had more time I'd've taken my tights off.

The style jumps across time boundaries – and you can get a bit confused at first when an interview with Jenny Lecoat leaps straight into Vesta Tilley and some comments on male impersonators, before returning to Jenny's new act; but it all makes sense in the end.

Particularly interesting on women in film and TV comedy, and amazing to see a book that uses nearly as many free promo stills as *The Punter*. A good buy at £5.95.

Crocodile Club: Smiles & Kemp/Wax Cabinet/ Devilfish Hornclub

The prospect of three male double acts (a loose expression) at a new venue seemed a little daunting. However, it was an excellent first night. Smiles & Kemp performed 'Naked City', an inspired skit on forties movies though the audience was slow to warm to them (my totally objective opinion, you understand). Wax Cabinet fared better. Graham, of Bleeding Obelisk, showed he has lost none of his powers of surrealist gibberish. Devilfish Hornclub were the comperes. Very relaxed and polished comperes they were, too. The new venue? Above the Rock in Kemp Town, so quite a trip.* But comfortable, intimate, and the acts were audible – so well worth the expedition. Every other Thursday: see posters and press for details!

Another look back in anger this month comes from Faber with 'The Incomplete Works of Jamie Reid' (£9.95). Lots of pics in a large-format paperback with all his graphic efforts from 'Anarchy in the UK' to 'Letter to Brezhnev', plus a look back at the Situationist International and the seminal 'Leaving the 20th Century'.

Things to do with a pair of scissors. With the Sex Pistols Jamie was unquestionably the man for the time, but most of this stuff was done better by Gross and Heartfield nearly 70 years ago. Still, the God Save The Queen cover remains the best image of that great royal occasion. This is it – 1987 – punk memories.



Radio Days


Woody Allen is a genius. Not all of his films are. He can make self-indulgent films like 'Stardust Memories'. He can make indifferent films like 'Broadway Danny Rose'. He can make slight films like 'Radio Days'. Neil Simon's 'Brighton Beach Memoirs' covered much the same ground as this last: growing up in the 1940s in a Jewish suburb. Whereas 'Brighton Beach' was touching, funny and poignant, 'Radio Days' is not. The use of the radio for links between small stories about the lives of radio stars is ineffective. The rabbi scene is very funny, but this is neither Allen at his most funny nor his most observant. Of course, I'll see his next film – even an indifferent Woody Allen is better than ninety per cent of film makers. But 'Radio Days' left me disappointed.
